A letter was read from the Yost Auto Co., in which they state that they will pay for the engineering cost and any other costs for the vacating of a portion of the alley in Block 121.

A letter was read from Mrs. Paul Kalushe about the unsanitary condition of the rats at the city dump. A motion was made by Waggoner that the Street Supt. be given authority to check the garbage dump and see that the dump is covered.

Ordinance No. 564.

An Ordinance vacating the West one hundred twenty (120) feet of the alley in Block 121, Plat of the City of Edmonds, Snohomish County, Washington.

WHEREAS, the owners of more than two-thirds of the private property abutting upon that portion of the alley hereinafter described, in the City of Edmonds, duly filed their Petition with the City Council of the City of Edmonds, praying for the vacation of said alley; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the said City did by Resolution duly adopted fix the 5th day of November, 1946 at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. of said day for the hearing and determination of said Petition; and

WHEREAS, due and legal notice of the time and place of hearing and determination on said petition has been duly given by the City Clerk as required by law; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the City Council that the said Petition should be granted and the said Council does hereby determine to vacate said portion of such alley; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDMONDS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the West one hundred twenty (120) feet of the alley in Block 121, Plat of the City of Edmonds, Edmonds, Snohomish County, Washington, be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley.

Passed by the City Council of the City of Edmonds this 7 day of January 1947.

A motion was made by Chandler and seconded by McGibbon that Ordinance No. 564 be adopted. Motion carried.

Mayor Fournier expressed a vote of thanks to Councilman Chandler for his faithful service as councilman for the City of Edmonds.

Mr. Tucker and Maxwell took their places for councilmen of the first and third wards. Mayor Fournier appointed Mr. Clausen for Councilman for the third ward for a two year term. A motion was made by Siefert and seconded by McGinness that the Council approve the appointment. Motion carried.

Mayor Fourtner appointed Councilmen McGinness, Siefert and Maxwell on the street committee. The Water Committee Councilmen Clausen, chairman, McGibbon and Tucker. The Park committee Cleve Little, Councilmen Waggoner, McGibbon, ~~Siefert~~ and Max Meyring.

The Assessment roll for L. I. D. 58 was filed with the City Clerk, with February 4 being set for the date of hearing. A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by McGibbon that notices be sent out of the hearing 15 days before the date of hearing. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by McGinness that the contractor be paid for removing of the tress on Eighth and Main street. Passed by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Victor Long came before the Council with his plans for his new building on second and Main streets. He asked to break down the curb on main street in front of the building. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by McGinness that he be given permission to break down the curb leaving ten feet in front of the pumps, but he must do this at his own expense and if any meters or lines must be moved he must stand the expense of this. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Clausen and seconded by McGinness that the property owner on the West of this property be notified to remove the obstruction in his driveway. Motion carried.

Councilman McGinness suggested that the street ~~committee~~<sup>Supt.</sup> make a survey of the alleys in the city. He also suggested that the street committee make a report on the street improvements for the year. The clerk was asked to have a notice put in the paper asking the people in the south side of the city, to come to the next council meeting in regards to any improvements that may be wanted.

Water Supt. McKeefer reported that several people in So. Edmonds wanted water, he suggested laying a two inch line to take care of them. He also suggested raising the rate of installing of meters. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Waggoner that this be referred to the water committee. Motion carried.

Councilman McGinness suggested that the water committee make a survey of the water system and the extending of water lines.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Council met in regular session with Mayor Fourtner presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present McGibbon, Waggoner, Tucker, McGinness, Siefert, Clausen and Maxwell.

A letter was read from Johns-Manville Corp. in which they state that the four inch Transite Pressure Pipe, had been raised in price to .723 cents per foot. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by McGinness that we accept this order if the Engineer cannot obtain cast Iron pipe. Motion carried.

John Crymes came before the Council in regards to connecting a building on Bell-street to the sewer. A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Siefert that the engineer make an investigation of the sewer and that Mr. Crymes be given permission to tie in to the sewer and pay \$100 for the connection. Motion carried.

A number of Boy Scouts came before the Council and asked for permission to use the south five acres for a meeting place, that they intended to build a cabin 20 by 40 feet. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by Tucker that the post be given permission to erect their building under the supervision of the Park Board. Motion carried.

Mayor Fourtner appointed Otto Anderson as Attorney for the City of Edmonds. A motion was made by Tucker and seconded by Waggoner that the appointment be accepted by the Council. Motion carried.

Mayor Fourtner read a letter from Gladys Leighton, complimenting Chief of Police Holmquist on his work for the City of Edmonds.

A motion was made by Siefert that the Clerk notify the State Highway Dept. of the condition of the Highway on South Fifth Street, also to inquire about a getting a permanent surface to the curb from Howell way to the South city limits. Motion carried. Motion seconded by McGibbon.

A motion was made by Tucker and seconded by Waggoner that the Ferry Lease be laid over until the next meeting of the Council.

Councilman McGinness suggested that the City take over the garbage and make the collections. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by McGibbon that the mayor appoint a committee to investigate the garbage situation. Motion carried. Mayor Fourtner appointed McKeever, Waggoner and Holmquist on this committee.

Councilman McGinness reported on improvements for the year, which include the proposed sewers and grading and surfacing of some streets.

Councilman McGibbon reported for the water committee, he suggested raising the fee for water connections to \$40 inside the city and \$100 for connections outside the City. He recommended that this be laid over until the next meeting.

Councilman Waggoner reported that a program had been made for the improvement of the City Park, and asked to have two more lights installed at the park, which cost \$1 per light.

A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Tucker that the finance committee turn in a report on the possibility of investing money in bonds. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Siefert and seconded by Maxwell that the clerk write to the Puget Sound Power & Light for two lights at the City park also to get a report on the ten lights which were ordered sometime ago.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Council met in regular session with Mayor Fourtner presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present McGibbon, Waggoner, Tucker, McGinness, Siefert, Clausen and Maxwell.

The Water collectors and treasurers reports were read. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Waggoner that the Bills which were approved by the finance committee be allowed and warrants be drawn on the proper funds. Motion carried.

A letter was read from Mrs. McReynolds, Sec. of Grade School P. T. A. asking about what is being done for a bathing beach. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by McGibbon that the Clerk answer this letter, telling them of the extending the outfall of the sewer, the cost of this project is to be met with the matching money from the state and an emergency ordinance for the balance of the cost. Motion carried.

The assessment roll for L. I. D. 58 came up for hearing. Because lots 1 & 2 in Block 120 were assessed before for the paving it was asked that they be taken from this assessment roll. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by McGinness that the City pay \$46.20 from the street fund to take care of this assessment. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Tucker and seconded by Waggoner that the taxes for lots 28 and 29 in Block D be paid from L. I. D. #43. Motion carried. After some discussion Councilman Tucker reind his motion.

A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Maxwell that the finance committee and attorney look into and report on L. I. D. 43.

A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Maxwell that lots 1 and 2 in Block 120 be stricken from the assessment roll. Motion carried.

#### Ordinance No. 565.

An Ordinance approving and confirming the assessment and assessment roll of Local Improvement District No. 58 for the improvement of Main Street in the City of Edmonds, from Fifth Street to Sixth Street by paving the center strip of said street with hot plant-mixed asphaltic concrete, and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement all in accordance with Resolution of Intention No. 115 of the City of Edmonds, levying an assessment on account thereof against the several lots, tracts and parcels of land as shown on said roll, providing for the issuance of Bonds therefor and fixing the date of the issuance thereof.

The City of Edmonds does ordain:

Section 1: That the assessment and assessment roll of Local Improvement District No. 58 for the improvement of Main Street, in the City of Edmonds, from Fifth Street to Sixth Street by paving the center strip of said street with hot plant-mixed asphaltic concrete, and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement, all in accordance with resolution of Intention No. 115 of the City of Edmonds, as the same now stands be and the same is hereby in all things approved.

Section 2: That each of the lots, tracts and parcels of land, or other property shown on said roll, is hereby declared to be specially benefitted by said improvement in at least the amount charged against the same, and that the assessment appearing against the same is in proportion to the several assessments appearing upon said Roll, and there is hereby levied an assessment against each lot, tract and parcel of land and other property appearing upon said Roll in the amount finally charged against the same thereon.

Section 3: That the 1st day of April, 1947 is hereby fixed as the date of the issuance of the Bonds required to be issued on account of said improvement.

Mr. Allen came before the Council and asked to have a larger water line run along sixth avenue North. He stated there were six users of the  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch line and in the summer time they did not have sufficient water. He also asked to have a light installed on sixth avenue <sup>North</sup> and to have the street extended. He was advised to have a petition drawn up and signed by the property owners.

A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Clausen that the treasurer negotiate with Mr. Cleveland at the Bank in regards to investing the some of the money now in the bank. Motion carried. Councilman Siefert voted no.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Council met in regular session with Mayor Fournier presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present McGibbon, Waggoner, Tucker, McGinness Siefert Clausen and Maxwell.

Ordinance No. 565 was read to the Council.

An Ordinance approving and confirming the assessment and assessment roll of Local Improvement District No. 58 for the improvement of Main Street in the City of Edmonds from Fifth Street to Sixth Street by paving the center strip of said Street with hot plant-mixed asphaltic concrete, and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement all in accordance with Resolution of Intention No. 115 of the City of Edmonds, levying an assessment on account thereof against the several lots, tracts and parcels of land as shown on said Roll; providing for the issuance of Bonds therefor and fixing the date of the issuance thereof.

A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by McGinness that Ordinance No. 565 be adopted. Passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

The Clerk was asked to read the petition which was signed by the property owners along the westerly boundary of Yost's Admiral way, which is now occupied by Pointer-Williametts Co., In this petition the Pointer-Williametts Co., agrees to improve and widen the road at their expense and ask the City bear the expense of upkeep and maintenance, A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Siefert that this be referred to the street committee to report at the next council meeting. Carried.

Mr. Caspers, owner of Caspers Service Station came before the Council. He stated that he was having black-top work done at his service station, and was having it extended to the concrete pavement. He asked if the City would pay part of the expense. A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by McGibbon that the City pay 40% of the cost of the black-top which will be put on the street, the work to be done under the supervision of the city Engineer Mr. Wolff. A rollecall vote showed McGibbon yes, Waggoner no, Tucker no, McGinness yes, Siefert no, Clausen yes, and Maxwell yes.

Fire Chief Matt Engels asked for two gas masks for the fire department. A motion was made by Siefert and seconded by McGibbon that he purchase two gas masks for the fire department. Motion carried. He also asked for a space to park a car from 7:30 A. M. to 6:30 P. M.. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by Siefert that a space be marked for the fire Dept. on Main street in front of the bank, and the car be so marked. Motion carried.

Emergency Ordinance No. 566 was introduced to the council. A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Waggoner this ordinance be published. Motion carried.

Councilman Waggoner made a motion that the Street Supt. not mark any more streets for loading zones. No second to this motion. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by Siefert that any illegal painted signs be taken off the streets, and the painting of new signs must be brought before the Council. Motion carried.





The Council met in regular session with Mayor Fourtner presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present McGibbon, Waggoner, Tucker, Siefert, McGinness, Clausen, and Maxwell

The water collectors and Treasurers reports were read. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Maxwell that the bills which were approved by the finance committee be allowed and warrants be drawn on the proper funds, and the bills for labor be paid from money budgeted for salaries. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Clausen and seconded by Tucker that the bill of Earl Gordon Co., which was paid by Mr. Caspers, be turned over to the Engineer to make an estimate cost of the portion of blank top, which was used on the city street. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Tucker and seconded by McGinness that the Clerk write the Attorney General in regards to investing of money from the City funds. Motion carried.

A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Waggoner that Emergency Ordinance # 566 be adopted. Passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 117.

A resolution declaring the intention of the City Council of the City of Edmonds to improve Fifth Street from the center line of Maple Street to the center line of Dayton Street; to improve Maple Street from the center line of Maple Street to the center line of Dayton Street; to improve Maple Street from the center line of Fifth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Alder street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Walnut Street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Ninth Street from the center line of Walnut Street to the center line of Maple Street by the construction and installation of a combination sanitary and storm sewer, together with the necessary manholes, inlets and appurtenances and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement; providing that the payment for said improvement be made by special assessment on the property in said district under the mode of payment by bonds for materials used, fixed estimate and all other expenses; and providing further, that the South half of Block 96 and the North half of Block 95, in the Plat of the City of Edmonds be exempt from such special assessments.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDMONDS:

1. That it is the intention of the City council of the City of Edmonds, Snohomish County, Washington, to improve Fifth Street from the center line of Maple Street to the center line of Dayton Street; to improve Maple Street from the center line of Fifth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Alder Street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Walnut Street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Ninth Street from the center line of Walnut Street to the center line of Maple Street by the construction and installation of a combination sanitary and storm sewer, together with the necessary manholes, inlets and appurtenances and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement.
2. That the cost and expense of all materials required to make a complete improvement, the fixed estimate and all other expenses of every kind shall be made by special assessment; a Local Improvement District shall be established embracing as near as may be all the property specially benefitted by such improvement, and such specially benefitted property shall be assessed to pay for the entire cost of such improvement; provided that the South half of Block 96 and the North half of Block 95 in the Plat of the City of Edmonds be exempt from any special assessments.
3. All persons who may desire to object to the improvement herein mentioned are hereby notified to appear at the Council Chambers in the City Hall, in the City of Edmonds, Washington, at a meeting of the said Council on the 1st day of April, 1947 at the hour of eight o'clock P. M., of said day, then and there to present their objections thereto if any they have.
4. The City Engineer of the said City of Edmonds is hereby directed to submit to the City Council, at or prior to said 1st day of April, 1947, the estimated cost and expense of the improvement, in this Resolution mentioned, and a statement of the proportionate amount thereof which shall be borne by the property within the proposed Improvement District; and a statement of the aggregate assessed valuation of the real estate, exclusive of improvements, within said proposed Improvement District, according to the valuation last placed upon it for general taxation, together with a diagram or print showing thereon the lots, tracts or parcels of land and other property which will be specially benefitted thereby, and the estimated amount of the cost and expense of such improvement to be borne by each lot, tract, parcel or land or other property.

Passed by the City Council of the City of Edmonds this 4th day of March, 1947 and approved the same date.

A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Waggoner that the alley between third and fourth avenues on Daley be improved. Motion carried.

Mr. Miller came before the council and stated that something should be done to take care of the water along Sprague street. A motion was made by McGinness and seconded by Waggoner that the engineer be authorized to take care of this condition. Motion carried.

A letter was read from the City Engineer Mr. Wolff that the Bell Street, Eighth and Seventh streets improvements had been completed. A motion was made by McGibbon and seconded by Waggoner that the council accept the recommendation of the City Engineer. Motion carried.

Councilman McGinness Chairman of the St. Committee recommends that the Pointer-Williamette be permitted to continue the use of Yost Admiral Way and develop the 20 feet temporary street now in use, but that it be clearly understood between Pointer Williamette and the City that any future developments by Pointer Williamette be instituted with the understanding that the closing of Yost Admiral way is absolutely temporary and should be opened at the earliest possible time, or at the will of the council. A motion was made by Waggoner and seconded by Tucker that this recommendation be accepted. Motion carried.

The opening of bids for Dayton street Sewer outfall was set for March 25.

March 18, 1947

The Council met in regular session with Mayor Fournier presiding the roll call showed all councilmen present.

Hugh Beeson, representing various property owners in the vicinity of Fourth and Main, requested that the four corners at the intersection be cut back or rounded off and stated that the property owners are prepared to bear the entire cost of the project except that the City stand the Engineering cost and the Puget Sound Power & Light Co. move its poles. A motion was made by Councilman Siefert and seconded by Tucker that this be referred to the City Engineer for estimates of cost, plans, etc, on a basis of doing the work by contract as compared by doing it with the City Street Dept. force. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Maxwell and seconded by McGinness that the Clerk request the P. S. Power & Light Co., to move its pole at Fourth and Main St. to a location as designated by the City Engineer. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by Waggoner that the Power Co.'s pole at Fifth & Main streets in front of Hubbard Insurance office be moved by the Power Co. to a location designated by the City Engineer. Motion carried.

G. Mason Hall and others, representing various citizens spoke on the desirability of the City taking some action to clean up the bathing beach in order to have it in readiness for use by the time the City has completed improvements to the sewer outfall. This to include the property now in use by the Pointer-Williamette Co., A motion was made by Councilman McGinness that the Clerk notify all persons now occupying or using portion of the waterway property under the jurisdiction of the City by authority from the State of Washington, in the vicinity of the foot of Dayton Street, to remove all personal property therefrom and vacate the premises within six days. The motion was amended by Councilman McGibbon that the City Engineer ascertain the limits or boundaries of such property. Motion was seconded by Councilman Maxwell. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Tucker to exclude from the previous motion all property, the occupancy of which has been authorized by the City Council. No. second.

The matter of renewal of lease at the foot of Main street to the Ferry Co., came up for discussion. No definite action was taken other than the Attorney was to press the Ferry Co. for action.

Resolution of Intention No. 118 was read for the improvement of Front Street from Bell Street to the alley South of Main street and for the improvement of Main Street from the center line of Second Street westerly to the Great Northern Railway Co's right of way by the construction of an eight inch sanitary sewer. Councilman Waggoner moved that Resolution of Intention No. 118 be adopted, with a second by McGinness. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness that the Park Committee give some thought to the matter of cleaning up the beach at the foot of Dayton Street and bring in a recommendation to the Council for improving the property for use as a bathing beach. Seconded by Councilman McGibbon. Motion carried.

Mr. Meyring, representing the Lions Club, spoke in favor of a Stop & Go light at Fifth and Main Street and moving the present traffic light from fifth and Main to Third and Main with red designation North and South and amber designation east and west. A motion was made by Councilman Waggoner and seconded by Tucker that the street committee investigate the matter and also look into the matter whether any additional or new lights should be installed and to determine the cost and submit a report to the council at its next regular meeting. Motion carried.

A request was made by representatives of the Church at Fifth and Dayton for permission to close the side walk on the North side of Dayton Street from Fifth street to the alley west. After some discussion it was decided the plan was not feasible.

There was some discussion about the driveway recently put ~~it~~ across the sidewalk just east of the Odd Fellows Building. A motion was made by Councilman Waggoner and seconded by Maxwell that the construction of the driveway be investigated by the City Engineer and if it was found that the same did not conform to standard practice, the City Clerk notify the party who constructed said driveway to make such changes in order to remedy the same so that it will conform to standard practice and be in accordance with plans on file with the City Engineer. Motion carried.

Councilman McGinness called for a report from the Chief of Police on the number of arrests made during the past two months for speeding and reckless driving, and for overtime and other parking regulations.

A motion was made by Councilman Siefert and seconded by McGinness that the Mayor appoint a committee of three to look into the police problem, in regard to the number of hours worked, the territory covered, etc., and bring in a report to the council at its next meeting. A protest was read with the signatures of all property owners against it, because of the lack of State matching funds. An Ordinance providing for the improvement of Fifth Street from the center line of Maple Street to the center line of Dayton Street; to improve Maple Street from the center line of Fifth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Alder Street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Walnut Street from the center line of Ninth Street to the center line of Eleventh Street; to improve Ninth Street from the center line of Walnut Street to the center line of Maple Street by the construction and installation of a combination sanitary and storm sewer, together with the necessary manholes, inlets and appurtenances and such other work as may be necessary to make a complete improvement, all in accordance with Resolution No. 117 of the City of Edmonds; creating an Assessment District; creating a Local Improvement District Fund therefor, and providing that payment for such improvement be made by special assessment on said District under the mode of payment by bonds.

A motion was made by Councilman Maxwell and seconded by McGinness that the interest be changed to five per cent instead of six per cent. Motion carried. A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by Maxwell that Ord. No. 567 be adopted. Passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

A petition was read for sewer, a larger water line, grading and a street light for Sixth avenue North. A motion was made by councilman McGibbon and seconded by Maxwell that the petition be referred to the Engineer. Motion carried.

Mr. Franklin came before the council and stated that he was not satisfied with the curb that was made two inches higher than the sidewalk. This was referred to the Street committee and the engineer for investigation.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by Waggoner that the St. Supt. be instructed to make the necessary repairs on the fountain in front of the Beeson building. Motion carried.

A letter was read from the Puget Sound Navigation co., in which they state that they feel that the increase in rental to \$400 per year is too high. A motion was made by Councilman Waggoner and seconded by Maxwell that the Attorney write again to the Ferry Co., to notify them that the council will accept a five year lease at \$400 per year, and would like a reply by the next council meeting, May 6. Motion carried.

Mayor Fournier brought up the taking of the census in the city of Edmonds. Councilman McGinness suggested asking the Chamber of Commerce in assisting of this. The Clerk was asked to write a letter to both companies notifying them that the Council is taking this under advisement.

Ordinance No. 568

An Ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 412 as amended by Section 1 of Ordinance No. 543 of the City of Edmonds relating to tapping fees for the installation of water service by the Water Department of said City.

The City of Edmonds Does Ordain:

Section 1: That Section 6 of Ordinance No. 412, as amended by Section 1, of Ordinance No. 543 of the City of Edmonds, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 6: No service connection less than three-fourths (3/4) inch in size shall be installed.

Tapping fees for the installation of water service, as hereinbefore provided, within the city limits of the City of Edmonds shall be as follows:

For a three-fourths (3/4) inch connection-----\$40.00  
For a one (1) inch connection-----\$60.00

For sizes larger than one (1) inch, or where it becomes necessary to install service pipe under paving, the actual cost of labor and material used in laying such a service and replacing the pavement shall be charged.

For the installation of water service outside of the city limits of the City of Edmonds the actual cost of labor and materials used in laying such a service and replacing the pavement shall be charged, but in no event shall such service be less than \$100.00

Tapping fees shall be paid in advance and in cases where the cost is not known the applicant shall pay the estimated cost and the proper adjustment shall be made after the actual cost is known to the Superintendent.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

Section 2: Any person, firm or corporation convicted of any violation of this Ordinance shall upon such conviction be punished by a fine of not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail of not to exceed ten (10) days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

Mr. Swensen, Chairman of the American Legion, asked for permission to place several booths on Main street, to sell tickets for the Fourth of July. A motion was made by Councilman Waggoner and seconded by Councilman Siefert that they be granted this permission. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Engels asked that the Ferry traffic be taken off Main Street from Third Avenue east for the Fourth of July and Labor Day, which are three day holidays. Councilman waggoner suggested that we try routing all ferry traffic down ~~Main~~ North to Edmonds Street then down First Avenue. Councilman McGinness made a motion that this be tabled until the next council meeting, with a second to the motion by Councilman Waggoner. Motion carried.

Mr. Hubbard came before the Council and made the statement that twenty homes were going to be build along Olympic ave. North and that were going to need water, and would like to have the city water. He stated a booster pump would be needed, which they would furnish and the line, if the city will furnish the water and maintain the line. A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by Councilman Siefert that this be referred to the water committee to report at the next council meeting. Motion carried.

A petition was read to the Council for black-top on Third Avenue North from Main Street to the North City limits, from the curb to the pavement. A motion was made by Councilman Waggoner and seconded by Councilman McGinness That this be turned over to the Engineer for checking and to the Attorney for a Resolution of Intention to be drawn up. Motion carried.

Councilman Tucker of the water committee suggested that the Engineer be authorized to inspect the 30,000 gal. tank, the old storage tank on Main St., the possibility of getting water from Seattle or Everett, meters for the pumps and to set up a cost accounting for the water department. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman Waggoner. Motion carried.

The water committee reported on the bill from the Laundry for damages done by dirty water, it was recommended that the claim be rejected, and the City not honor the damage claim. Mayor Fournier referred this to the Attorney and Committee.







An Ordinance regulating the hauling of garbage and providing punishment for the violation thereof.

The City of Edmonds does ordain:

Section 1. From and after the date of passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful to haul or transport wet garbage, swill or waste over the Streets of the City of Edmonds unless said wet garbage, swill or waste is placed in a closed, water tight container, and properly covered so as to prevent the escape of any wet garbage, swill or waste or the drainage therefrom.

Section 2. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

Section 2: That the City of Edmonds issue emergency warrants in the amount of \$1600 on the Street Fund, being the estimated amount required to meet the cost of additional labor necessarily incurred in the Street Department, and not budgeted, of the City of Edmonds for the remainder of the year 1947.

Section 3: An emergency is hereby declared to exist with reference to said expenses, which could not necessarily have been foreseen at the time of making the annual budget.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

Inasmuch as this was contrary to Engineer's instructions, we believe damage to property is soley result of contractor's negligence. We recommend that the city take no direct action but hold the contractor liable for satisfying Valentine's claim by refilling the area in question in order to prevent further erosion.

2. Reference to Rittenhouse Claim; Believe facts stated are correct and that final action be dependent on facts established by water committee with regards to negligence on part of city.

3. Reference to restricted parking by High School; Recommend that a no Parking zone between the hours of 8 A. M. and 4 P. M. be established on sixth between Glen and Daley Streets for a 30 day trial period and that instructive signs be erected.

We do not however, find the necessity of restricting parking on the South side of Glen Street and do not recommend that this action be taken.  
4 Reference to installation of catch-basin on Front St., Project completed in accordance with action taken by council.

5. Reference to Brackett Driveway: Dirt had been hauled in, but driveway definitely not repaired in manner suitable for use, although the Mayor advises that the Street Supt. had approved the job as being completed.

6. Reference to condition of streets; Streets recently improved appear to be holding up very well, but what few chuck holes that are developing are not being repaired in accordance with method ordered by the City Engineer. The unimproved streets are in very poor conditions, resulting for the most part, from a definite lack of grading.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded seconded by Councilman Maxwell that this report be recorded in the minutes. Motion carried.
