The Council met for its regular session with Mayor McGibbon presiding. The roll call showed the following Councilmen present Vollan, Tucker, Waggoner, McGinness, Engels, Maxwell and Savage.

The Treasurers report was read.

This was the night for the hearing on L. I. D. #62. There being no written protests filled against it a motion was made by Councilman Savage and seconded by Councilman Waggoner that Ordinance No. 599 approving and confirming the assessment roll be adopted Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by Councilman Tucker that the Street Supt. install a large catch basin at the foot of Main Street, East side of the Great Northern right of way, to be tied into the abandoned water main. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Clerk write a letter to the Crescent Laundry, letting them know that we will install a catch basin as soon as possible, to take of the city drainage water. Motion carried.

A letter was received from the Great Northern Railway inquiring about what has been done in regards to filling in of the two holes along Front street. The Street Committee recommended that the Great Northern be given permission to use some of the dirt at the Bell street crossing, and the city may be able to obtain free dirt for the rest of the fill but we do not have sufficient equipment for the hauling of the dirt. The Attorney was instructed to write the Great Northern in regards to this fact.

Councilman Also reported the condition of the streets, he stated that the snow was being hauled off and suggested that a crew be put on at night also. He also reported that no bus loading zone had been located as yet, but there is a possible chance of a location at the Richfield Service Station.

A motion was made by Councilman Maxwell and seconded by Councilman Vollan that a slow sign be placed on the North and South side of Dayton Street at Fourth, and the Children at Play sign to be posted. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman Savage that Max Meyring purchase four street monument, which he is to install, at Seventh & Dayton, Fourth & Bell, Third and Walnut and First & Edmonds streets. Motion carried.

A report was given on the sites for drilling for water. Mayor McGibbon stated the Contractor would not drill on the Smart property, also that Mr. Davison does not want to sell his property. And Mr. Zulauf wants \$2000, and a roadway would have to be purchased from Mr. Davison, for which he asks \$500. Mayor McGibbon stated he would like to contact the Johnson's about their property. Councilman Tucker made a motion that the Mayor be given power to negotiate for the City, and he be reimbursed for what earnest money is necessary and he pick the best site. Motion was withdrawn.

A motion was made by councilman Engels and seconded by Councilman Tucker that the Mayor be authorized to negotiate for a well site, not to exceed \$2000 with an earnest payment of \$200. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the barricades on Maple street to be posted, sliding at own risk, also to publish a notice in the paper. Motion carried.

Motion carried.

George Yost came before the council with the information of a loading zone for his busses. His report was that the Richfield Service Station is willing to let them set the waiting station on Dayton street. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Waggoner that this be referred to the Safety and Street committees for a report. Motion carried.

Dewey Leyda came before the council and stated that he was waiting to have the light pole on Fifth and Main street replaced by the Light Co., so he could finish his curb as this is a hazard condition. A motion was made by councilman Savage and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Clerk write the Light Co., in regards to this. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that the street Committee draw up plans for street improvements. A vote showed this did not carry.

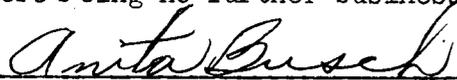
A motion was made by councilman Savage and seconded by councilman Waggoner that the water and street committee make a report on street grading and water lines, where streets do not now exist. Motion carried.

Councilman Tucker reported that the drilling equipment had been moved to the new well site and drilling would start within a few days.

Councilman Maxwell reported that Mel Tuson wanted the bus zone in front of his establishment. A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Savage that the bus zone be established in front of the Grill on Main Street between Fourth and Fifth Avenue, 50 feet West from the alley effective immediately. Motion carried.

The Street committee recommended that the house numbering be left as it is instead of changing to a number for every 30 feet.

Mr. Morse asks to have Second Avenue extended to the North City limits. A motion was made by Councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Engels that this be referred to the street committee for a report to be brought in for the next Tuesday meeting. Motion carried.

Mayor McGibbon reported he had a visit with Roy Sorensen, and he asked for reconsideration on the bus zone. Mr. Crow stated he was willing to have the bus zone in front of his place of business on Fifth Avenue South. A motion was made by councilman Tucker that the bus zone be changed back to its previous location on Fifth Avenue. Councilman withdrew his motion.

A motion was made by Councilman Savage that the bus zone be established in front of Edmonds Motor Co. No second to the motion.

Councilman Tucker made a motion to recind his previous motion to transfer the bus zone to Main street.

A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Tucker that his previous motion for the bus zone to be in front of the Grill on Main street be recinded, and it be changed to Fifth Avenue in front of Crow Hardware and the existing waiting station be removed. A roll call vote showed Vollan no, Tucker yes, Waggoner no, McGinness no, Maxwell no and Savage yes. There being 4 nos and 2 yes Councilman Tucker made a motion to table it until the next meeting, Savage seconded the motion. A roll call vote showed Vollan no, Tucker yes, Waggoner no, McGinness yes, Maxwell no, and Savage no. There being a vote of 4 nos and 2 yes A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by Councilman Tucker that the action of the bus zone to be in front of the Grill be recinded. A roll call vote showed Vollan yes, Tucker yes, Waggoner no, McGinness no, Maxwell no, and Savage yes. There being 3 yes and 3 no a decision was made for the bus zone to be in front of the Grill.

The Street committee recommended the extending of Second Street from Edmonds Street to the North City limits also Fourth Avenue from Walnut to the South City limits and <sup>Second Avenue from</sup> James street to Dayton Street.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker to allow the Mayor to obtain Quit-Claim deeds for streets on these pieces of property. Motion withdrawn. A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Waggoner that the following streets be extended, Second Avenue from Edmonds street to North city limits, Fourth Avenue from Walnut street to the South City limits, and Second Avenue from James street to Dayton Street, for a 60 foot right of way and the Mayor be given the power to obtain the quit-claim deeds. Motion carried.

James Long came before the Council and stated the Army would like special permission to place the sign on the sidewalk. A motion was made by councilman Waggoner and seconded by Councilman McGinness that this be referred to the safety committee. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Tucker that the street known as the North City limits street from First Avenue to Seventh Avenue be named Casper Street and a resolution be drawn up for same. Motion carried.

Three bids were received for a pick-up truck. One from Edmonds Motor Co. for \$1459, less 100 allowance for the old truck, making total price of \$1359.00, Hopper Chevrolet Co. bids was 1518.75 less a trade in of 158.75, making a total price of 1360. also a bid from Everett truck Sales for a pick-up truck 1775. less trade in 151.75 making a total price of 1623.25. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Waggoner that these bids be referred to the Street and Water Committees for consideration and to report at the next meeting. Motion carried.

This was the night set for the hearing on rezoning the Southwest corner of Fifth and Howell way. Councilman Maxwell stated the widening of the Fifth Avenue should be taken under consideration. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman Vollan that this property be rezoned from a residential zone to a commercial zone. Motion carried.

The petition of Philip Smart in which he states he would like to purchase the West 15 feet of lot 29 in Block 121 was read to the council. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman McGinness that the Clerk call for bids, with the Council reserving the right to reject any or all bids. A roll call vote showed Vollan yes, Tucker yes, Waggoner no, McGinness yes, Engels yes and Maxwell no. Motion carried.

Attorney Holte prepared a Resolution for the renaming of the North City Limits Street to Caspers Street. A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Waggoner to accept this Resolution of naming this Street Casper Street. Motion carried.

People living on Fourth Avenue South asks for a reconsideration of having the sub-station on that street. Mr. Shaw outlined plans for the sub-station, he stated there would be a cyclone fence around the property which would be 8 feet high, also poles would be 50 feet high with a lawn in front of the sub-station, he also stated they did not have another site. A motion was made by councilman Tucker that we request the Power Co., to investigate the availability of an alternate site and request them not to begin building and to meet with the Council one week from tonight.

A motion was made by councilman Engels that the Council reconsider the motion of last week approving the location of the sub-station. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman McGinness to re-open and continue this matter at a special meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Tucker that the P. U. D. be requested not to proceed with their construction until after the next meeting. Motion carried.

Mr. Hall asked to have Third Avenue south <sup>filled</sup> also people will not have to walk in the street. Mayor McGibbon referred this to the street committee.

Councilman Maxwell, chairman of the safety committee, recommended that the Attorney write to the Army Rec. Office that the City has no objection to their sign being placed on the sidewalk, that we will not be responsible for any accidents accuring from same, this was made a motion by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Waggoner. Motion carried.

Mayor McGibbon appointed Clarence Hawkins for a relief patrolman two nights a week and he be employed for other work the rest of the week. Councilman Maxwell made a motion that the appointment be confirmed, <sup>with the pay of 250. per month</sup> councilman Vollan seconded. Motion carried.

Mayor McGibbon recommended that the Police Judge use the City Hall for his work at night and the former office of the Clerk be turned over to the police department.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Waggoner that the used desk for the police department be purchased for \$15. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Vollan that directional signs to the City Hall be painted. Motion carried.

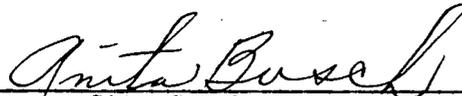

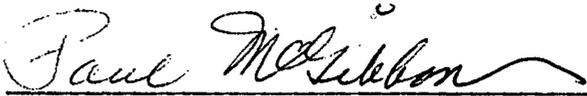

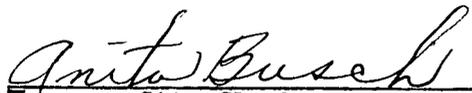
