Councilman McGinness reported he had received the final report on the sewers.





Mayor McGibbon asked that no purchases be made or extra men be hired in all departments before getting in touch with him.



The Council met for its regular session with Councilman Vollan presiding as Mayor Pro tem. The roll call showed the following councilmen present Vollan, Tucker, Tuson, McGinness, Engels and Maxwell.

The Clerk read the returns for the City General Election held March 13, 1951. W. W. Womer received 56 votes for Treasurer for a four year term, Alfred O. Holte received 54 votes for attorney for a four year term, Victor Holmquist received 50 votes for Councilman at Large for a two year term, and Ernie Vollan 3 votes, Donald Tuson Councilman First ward received 18 votes, for a four year term, Ernie Vollan, Councilman second ward received 7 votes, for a four year term, and Earl Morrison received 4 votes and Ray Cloud, Gus Swanson Bill Crow, Eugene Stine, A. B. Miller, L. H. Bradbury and A. W. Hall receiving one vote each. Gordon Maxwell Councilman Third Ward received 12 votes for a four year term and A. B. Miller Councilman of Third received 13 votes, for a two year term and E. Vollan received one vote.

A letter was from the Alderwood Construction Co., in which they make an offer to the city for the Austin Grader of \$150.00. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that we accept this offer of \$150 and the money to go to the street fund. Motion carried.

The Assessment roll for L. I. D. 64 was turned over to the City Clerk for checking. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the notice of the hearing on the assessment roll be published and notices be sent out to the property owners affected by the improvement. Motion carried.

The claim from C. O. Wheeler in which he states he has been damaged to the amount of \$2000 was turned over to Attorney Holte. He stated we should reject the claim.

The item of lights at the city park was brought up before the council. Max Meyring stated he would have a report to make on this at the next meeting.

Councilman McGinness reported that the strance property can be partially drained by a three or four foot ditch along Fourth Avenue.

Councilman Tucker reported the surging of the wells had been started, and in pulling the pump it was found out that the bowls needed repairing or new one should be installed. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Vollan that new bowls be purchased for repairing of the pump. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman McGinness that the Engineer draw up plans for the using of water from Shell Creek and submit them to the State Health Department for approval, with the fee for Engineering at 10%. Motion did not carry.

With Mayor McGibbon presenting himself before the meeting Mayor pro tem Vollan resumed his duties as councilman.

A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman McGinness to reconsider the drawing up of plans to be submitted to the State Health Department. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman McGinness that the water committee be instructed to investigate the purchasing of water from the Alderwood water District. Motion carried.

After considerable discussion a motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Engineer draw up plans to submit to the State Health Department, with 10% fee for the Engineer cost. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Tuson that the Finance committee bring in a report next meeting, with recommendations concerning salaries and increased expenses and give methods most feasible for raising the necessary money. Motion carried.

A recommendation from the Finance Committee was read to the Council, in which it states they recommend that we offer for sale at par the bonds now held in the Investment Account. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the bonds be sold at par plus accrued interest. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that the request to connect to the sewer at Casper street be referred to the Attorney and street committee for action. Motion carried.

Mr. Marshall came before the council asking permission to extend the sewer 600 feet east from Sixth avenue on Glen Street, with an eight inch sewer. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that this be referred to the street committee. Motion carried.

Councilman McGinness tendered his resignation as councilman of Second ward. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that we accept his resignation with an appreciation from the council for his services for the past four years. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Council accept the resignation of Ernie Vollan councilman at Large. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by councilman Engels that the Council nominate Ernie Vollan for councilman second ward to fill the unexpired term of McGinness. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Engels and seconded by councilman Tuson that the Council nominate Vic Holmquist for Councilman at large to fill the unexpired term of Ernie Vollan. Motion carried.

Upon recommendation of the street committee a motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Tuson that the city accept the 20 foot strip of land lying adjacent to Erben Drive between third and fifth avenue, and a 60 foot strip of land from Erben Drive to Ward Street (4th extended), with the understanding that the city will grade 4th through from Ward to Erben Drive and provide for the drainage of 4th street only, and a letter be written to the Strancés about the council action. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Tuson that the request to lower the ditch on Casper street be referred to the Street committee. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Tuson that all labor be raised to \$1.37 per hour until further action. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the bills be allowed and warrants be drawn on the proper funds with the exception of the bill from the Superior construction company, which is to be held up until the Engineer turns in his approval of the work. Motion carried.

A report from the water committee if we should dig another well at the steel tank area it would cost us from \$1600 to 1800 and we would probably get 75 gallon of water per minute; if we got water from Alderwood water district we will have to pay 25¢ per 100 Cu. Ft., and we can have 150 gallon per minute for eight hours by filling up at night, on a one year basis, or we can develop shell creek, which will mean laying of 400 feet of pipe, chlorination and a roadway, with an estimated cost of \$2000 plus engineering, with the state allowing us to use the water for one year. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman McGinness that we proceed with the shell creek development as outlined. An amendment to the motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that shell creek development take second place over a well. A vote on the amendment showed two yes and four nos. A vote on the motion showed it carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Mr. Gerdon asked that a project be set up to improve Caspers street from Third avenue to Sunset Avenue, on a 40-60 basis. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that the city pay 40% of the street improvement, the property owners to pay 60% and bear all expense of curb and gutter, subject to final approval by the council after the Engineers estimate has been presented, engineering to be paid from the street fund. Motion carried.

Mr. Marshall ask for permission to install a sewer from 6th to 7th North of Glen street. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that permission be granted him to put in an 8 inch sewer with the necessary manholes as per engineers instructions and same be turned over to the city together with the necessary property easements, or that he extend his present 6 inch connection the same to be retained as a private sewer only. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that the first Council meeting night be devoted to the general order of business and paying of bills and the second meeting night be for committee meetings and committee reports. Motion carried.

The question of the current Expense account was referred to the several committees.

An easment from George Yost to lay a water line along his property in the Hannah Park addition was read to the council, and ordered to be recorded.

A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Tuson that the bills which were approved by the auditing committee be allowed and warrants be drawn on the proper funds. Motion carried.

This was the night set for the hearing of the annexation of a piece of property owned by Douglas Gootee, just north of the north city limits. There being no one opposing the annexation a motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that Ordinance No. 611 be adopted and published. Motion carried.

An amendment to the traffic code making the speed limit in the alleys ten miles per hour was read to the Council and ordered published.

A bid was received from the United Paving Co., for the paving of Caspers street from Third Avenue to Sunset Avenue, in the amount of \$5729.55 to the property owners and \$1639.02 for the city's portion of 40% of the paving. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that we accept the bid of United Paving Co. and all money of private citizens be put in escrow and the maximum cost not to exceed \$5729.55 and the city share not to exceed \$1639.02 and curb and gutter. Motion carried.

A report from the chairman of the water committee Tucker was given to the council in which he has received a letter from the State Health Department stating the the City can use the water from shell Creek for one year, samples of water must besent in to their office twice monthly, and that we are to go ahead with the development of this water through under ground source. He also stated the meter fees should be raised to \$55 and \$115, that the discount should be lowered to 25 ¢ and the sprinkling rate should be 15¢ for this year.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels to change the rebate from 50¢ to 25¢ for the two month period. A vote on the motion showed two yes and three no.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker that the 50¢ rebate be removed from the water bills, with a second from Councilman Maxwell. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the meter installation rate be raised to \$55 in the city limits and \$115 outside the city limits. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that the sprinkling rate be set for 15¢ per 100 Cu. Ft. over the minimum of 800 Cu. Ft. Motion carried.

The Clock showing 10:15 the meeting adjourned.

It was recommended by the street committee that no further dirt be taken from Alder street between fifth and sixth Avenue except by the City.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Engels that the Attorney draw up an ordinance prohibiting automatic cigarette machines in places where minors are allowed. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the City co-operate with the county request on the per capita basis of 50¢ for civil Defense. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Holmquist that due to the high cost of living the two regular policemen work the days of the relief patrolman and be paid for the extra time, not to exceed the amount budgeted. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the water Supt. and Asst. be paid \$1.37 per hour for four hours Saturday and Sunday for standby time, shared by the two men, if he is capable, beginning May 1. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that a four inch main be installed when possible to do so, on Eighth avenue between Bell and Edmonds Streets no hydrant to be installed at this time. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Holmquist that the finance committee bring in a report next council meeting on the means of paying the water bills. Motion carried.







A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Engels that the Supt. Lawson be authorized to install a catch basin at Fourth and Howell Way. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that the sewer report made by Carey and Kramer several months ago be adopted unless some specific reason be brought up by the Council to change it. Councilman asked that this be tabled. Mayor McGibbon referred the to the street committee and the Engineer to make a report on January 15.

A motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by councilman Vollan that our next meeting be January 2nd instead of the First which is a Holiday. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the Clerk write a letter to Postmaster Sorensen and ask for information in regards to mail carrier service within the City. Motion carried.

Mayor McGibbon instructed Supt. Lawson, **and Councilman Vollan, chairman of code & zoning Committee** to institute action in regards to the buildings on the Mr. Armes property.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
