Al Brandt asks for a lease to the property he now pays rent for to the City. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that this matter be referred to the Street committee and Attorney Holte to report on at the first meeting in February. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Clerk call for bids for a new car for the Police Department. The car is to be a four door sedan with equipment as specified, bids to be opened February 5. Motion carried.

The Council met for its regular session with Mayor McGibbon presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present Holmquist, Tucker, Tuson, Vollan, Engels, Maxwell and Miller.

The Treasurers report was read. The Clerk reported Postmaster Otto Sorensen stated the Postal Inspector has made his check in the City of Edmonds for mail carrier service and his report has been sent to Washington for approval.

One bid was received for the blanket insurance for the City of Edmonds, from General American Company, in the amount of \$770.81 for one year. A motion was made by Councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that we accept this bid

With E. B. Hubbard agent for the insurance. Motion carried. The question of carrying fire and theft insurance on the Fire truck was brought up to the council.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that the contract for oil for the City Hall be given to Louie May for the rest of this year, at .115 per gallon, with the stipulation that the council shift this account from one merchant to another, providing the prices are the same. Motion carried.

Attorney Holte reported several items for the code committee, that a person moving buildings must have a city license, he must have an indemnity bond of \$25,000, also a permit to move each house, and he must pay \$25 for an inspection fee, which will be refunded to him after the inspection charge is paid from it, also that a building 8 X 12 or larger that is to be moved, must have a building permit before a moving permit is obtained. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that this recommendation be adopted. Motion carried.

Also as Mr. Arnes has done nothing to the building which he took out a building permit for it was recommended that he obtain another permit with his plans for this building. It was also recommended that the building at Main and Sunset avenue be removed as it is a hazard. It was also recommended that the State safety code for blasting be adopted with the requirement of a permit and indemnity bond. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Vollan that this report be accepted and that blasting be a part of our city code. Motion carried.

Councilman Tucker reported for the water committee of a change in water rates, by making the rate \$4.50 for two month plus tax and giving the rebate of 50¢ if bill is paid by the 15th of the month, also a change of the 4¢ rate to 8¢, and that the sprinkling rate be the same for the home user as the commercial user, if he gets up in the higher bracket. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that this recommendation be adopted and an ordinance be drawn up. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the Water Supt. install two hydrants on Ninth Avenue South, the Fire Chief to be consulted in regards to their placing. Motion carried.


In regards to the leasing the street property to Al Brandt, Councilman Tuson reported that the Street Department does not have the power to lease the street.


A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Holmquist that we accept the sewer report made by Carey and Kramer. Motion carried.

Attorney Holte reported he had received a letter from Mrs. Kinsey stating her building at First and Main street would be removed by May 1.


RECOMMENDATION OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE

Supt. Lawson reported on the pipe line extensions and replacements that should be put in this coming year. He also stated before the State Highway extends the pavement, the curb should be put in along Fifth Avenue from Main street to the Maple Street, providing it is not already in. He also stated that curb and gutter would cost about \$2 per lineal foot.

The Council met for its regular session with Mayor McGibbon presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present Holmquist, Tucker, Vollan, Engels and Maxwell.

The Treasurers report was read to the Council.

Attorney Holte read Ordinance No. 617, confirming the Assessment roll for L. I. D. #65. Also an amendment to the water ordinance, to change the rates and put on the discount was read. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that this ordinance be passed. A roll call vote showed Holmquist yes, Tucker yes, Vollan no, Engels yes and Maxwell no. There being only three votes for this ordinance it did not pass. Councilman Vollan asked for a reconsideration on this ordinance.

Attorney Holte reported to the council that Pointer Williamette wanted a lease to the property at the foot of Dayton street from the Port District and the City of Edmonds, he also stated he would draw up the lease, so the City can sign it.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Holmquist that the Methodist Church be given permission to place their no parking signs in front of the church on Sundays and for special occasions. Motion carried.

After some consideration on the bids for a police car a motion was made by councilman Maxwell that we accept the bid from Hopper Chevrolet Co., for the 1952 Chevrolet Delux model for \$1920.20 with equipment only subject to modification. The motion received no second so Councilman Tucker made a motion that the bids be postponed until next meeting. No second. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that we reject all bids and call for bids as revised by the safety committee. Motion carried. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and Holmquist that we call for bids next council meeting March 4. Motion carried.

Supt. Lawson reported on the costs of three projects for laying water pipe, from 9th to 8th on Cedar street with a hydrant on Cedar street, and 675 feet of pipe with a cost of \$814.20, 300 feet of 4 inch pipe on Eighth Avenue from Bell to Edmonds street, at a cost of \$293.15, and the replacement of the one inch line between 9th and 10th east to Olympic avenue and North to Edmonds Street with a six inch main with two hydrants for a cost of \$1957.01, a total cost for three projects of \$3064.36.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that Mr. Meyring be designated to engineer the laying of pipe on the three projects not to exceed \$300. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that we call for bids for laying of pipe on March 19. Motion carried.

Supt. Lawson reported that the Methodist Church, Richfield Service and A. B. Miller are going to put in their curb and gutter on Fifth Avenue South.

Mayor McGibbon reported the Chamber of Commerce are willing to co-operate with the city in getting our streets black-topped.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

A request from

Mr. D. R. Lynn asked for permission to use 25 feet on the southside of Maple street to stake his lumber while building his new home, he also stated he would keep lights out at night. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Vollan that Mr. Lynn be allowed to use the south 15 feet of Maple street in front of his property for a period of 60 days, under the direction of the police department, and he must furnish an Indemity Bond for \$10,000. Motion carried.

A letter was read from Al Brandt in which he states he would like to purchase lots 3, 4, 5 and 6 in block 14 plat of the city of Edmonds, Mayor pro tem Tucker suggested this be held over until we get a deed from the County.

As there were no objections to the assessments on L. I. D. No 65

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that Ord. No 617, confirming the assessment Roll for L. I. D. No. 65 be passed and published. Motion carried.

Two bids were received for a police car one from Hopper Chevrolet in which he re-submitted his bid for a Chevrolet car with a bid for an Oldsmobile car of 145 H. P. for \$2358, the other bid from Edmonds Motor Co., in the amount of \$ 2299.41 with special equipment.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Miller that we accept the bid for the Chevrolet Delux four door sedan with special equipment subject to modification. A roll call vote showed Holmquist yes, Tuson yes, Engels no, Vollan yes, Maxwell yes and Miller yes. After some discussion and several councilmen withdrawing their votes a motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman tuson to reconsider the purchase of the car. A roll call vote showed 2 no and two yes. A motion was made by councilman Holmquist and seconded by councilman Tuson to reject all bids and call for bids for a police car, the safety committee and attorney to draw up the call for bids. A letter was read from the Washington State Liquor Control Board in which they ask for a five minute parking zone on Fourth Avenue just north of Main street between 12 noon and 8 P. M. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell to refer this to the safety committee. Motion carried.

The request from Mr. Wickstrom for ^{the water department to} furnishing pipe for a water line was referred to the water committee.

A letter was read from Warren A. Bishop asking for a Local Improvement District for a sewer in the Willis District, also a number of residents from this district were present at this meeting. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by Councilman Maxwell that this matter be referred to the Street committee for consideration

Mr. Marshall came before the council and stated that he had completed his sewer but was unable to collect the money from the property owners for their share as was promised him. A bid was received from Hopper Chevrolet Co., for a police car in the amounts of \$1847.46, 1930.30 and 2,091.49, amounts include 134.00 Federal Excise tax, also a letter was read from Edmonds Motor Co. A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Vollan to accept the bid from Hopper Chevrolet Co., for a DeLux four door sedan for \$1,930.30 less federal excise tax of 126.00, plus 3% tax less \$700 turn in for the old car. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Maxwell that the City deed the North 30 feet of the street west of the Railroad right of way to the Port District, (with the stipulation that any revenues derived from concessions be paid to the City.) Motion carried.

A petition was read to the council for the rezoning of lots 3 and 4 in Block J, for commercial property. A motion was made by councilman Miller and seconded by councilman Vollan that April 1 be set for the date of hearing on rezoning this property. Motion carried.

A letter was read from Dr. Kenny Health Officer for the City about the condition that he found at the Schuster Soap Factory, which he has inspected two times. Six bids were received for the laying of water mains, one from Joe Colluccio for \$1809.00, Thos. H. Kent, for \$1580, Ralph R. McKay for \$2458.48, Edward W. Hayes \$1693.00, John M. Bruch, \$2,177.00, and Davis & Ryland Contractors, \$1553.80. A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Tuson to accept the bid from Davis & Ryland contractors also that he must post a performance bond and the Attorney is to draw up the contract, work is to be started with 15 days after the signing of the contract and to be completed within 45 days. Motion carried.

Attorney read the Ordinance by title for the setting up of L. I. D. # 66, for a sewer on Dayton street from Seventh to Ninth Avenue.

This was the night set for the hearing on rezoning of lots 3 and 4 in Block J from a residential zone to a commercial zone. There being no objection to the rezoning a motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Vollan for lots 3 and 4 in Block J be changed from a residential zone to a commercial zone, Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by councilman Tucker that the street committee does not recommend the purchase of the Marshall sewer. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by councilman Holmquist that Mrs Murdock be notified that the Street committee is not in favor of graveling Eighth avenue from Spruce to Pine street. Motion carried

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Holmquist that the street committee be authorized the necessary money for engineering of the sewer on Daley and Sprague streets, with the understanding that the L. I. D. District pay for this. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tucker and seconded by councilman Engels that the Supt. be authorized to proceed with the laying of pipe, not to exceed 700 feet plus one hydrant, the city to furnish the pipe and hydrant, pipe to be laid according to specification of the Supt., the actual cost of installation to be paid by Mr. Wickstrom. Four meters must be paid for in advance before the pipe is installed. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Vollan and seconded by councilman Tuson that permission be denied Mr. Phillips to construct a garage on Daley street unless he conforms with the building code. Motion carried.




It was also brought up before the council that it was the intend of the committee that the west side of sunset avenue constitute the boundary for the commercial and Industrial Zone.

A motion was made by Councilman Maxwell that the petitions for street improvement be turned over to the street committee for approval.

Mr. Shorett came before the council with a petition with 11 signers for water on 100 Avenue west. This was referred to the water committee.

Mr. Gerdon ask to have water furnished to his property North of our South Edmonds water tank. This was also referred to the Water committee for consideration.

The condition of the alley between Main and Dayton streets just east of Fifth Avenue was referred to the street committee.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tucker that the Supt. have the hydrant at sixth and alder street raised. Motion carried.






