

March 16, 1954

The Council met for its regular session with Mayor McGibbon presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present Tuson, Talen, Kincaid, Maxwell, Bishop and McGinness.

A letter from Wright, Booth & Beresford, Laywers for L. O. Franklin, was turned + over to Attorney Holte for answering.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Talen that Ord. # 651 relating to local improvements in the City of Edmonds, and setting up procedures to be followed in accordance with the Laws of the State of Washington, and repealing Ordinance No. 285 and all other ordinances in conflict herewith. Motion carried.

April 6 is the date set for the call for bids on the grader.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman McGinness that the attorney draw up an emergency Ordinance #652 for the expenditure of \$2575 for the purchase of a grader, and the hearing beset for April 6. Motion carried.

A petition was received from property owners residing in the Woodway and Yost precincts asking to be deleted from the proposed annexation to the City of Edmonds.

Mrs. Vera Henderson again came before the council with the problem of drainage from the Richfield Oil Service station on to her property.

Mr. Kochrian came before the council in regards to the erosion of the earth at tenth and Maple streets. A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded

by councilman Bishop that this be referred to the water committee for action. Motion carried.

The letter from property owners from Vista Lane to Daley street on Olympic Avenue requesting that we bridge the gap in the existing water line, was taken under advisement by the water committee, and the Clerk was asked to write said property owners stating that we want more particulars as to the need for this extention.

The water committee recommended canceling the water bill of Helen Reynolds from Sept 16 to Nov. 4 for \$5.25

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that we purchase a used pump for Cascade Machinery with the pipe and fittings. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Tuson that we call for bids April 6, to put a roof on the concrete resouvoir at ninth and Main streets at an estimated cost of \$5000 not including the fence. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman Talen that the water department lay approximately 240 feet of four inch water line on Daley street west of ninth avenue. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Maxwell that Attorney Holte write Mr. Learned to reconstruct his sidewalk on Dayton street. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Maxwell that Attorney Holte prepare an amendment to the city code 6-3.05 Washington state laws for repairing damaged sidewalks. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Tuson that Mr. Schneider be authorized to replace the sidewalk curb and gutter at Fifth and Main street under the supervision of the Superintendent. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman McGinness and seconded by councilman Kincaid that Attorney Holte write to H. B. Joslin requesting him to remove the drainage obstruction between Sprague and Daley streets. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Maxwell and seconded by councilman McGinness that the Clerk answer the letter from Mrs. Lovett, in which she states she fell on the sidewalk on dayton street. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
