

September 20, 1955

The Council met for its regular session with Mayor Maxwell presiding. The roll call showed the following councilmen present, Tuson, Talen, Kincaid, Cloud, Bishop and Sommerseth.

This was the night set for the hearing on three annexations to the City of Edmonds; No 1, all of Block 3 and 4, and lot 1 in Block 2, in the South Park Addition to Edmonds, there being no one objecting to the annexation a motion was made by Councilman Tuson and seconded by Councilman Bishop that Ord. No. 666, annexating said property to the City of Edmonds, be passed. Motion carried.

No. 2, for annexating the property North of the City, changing the City limits from Seventh avenue East to Ninth avenue, then north to 196th, then to the north line of Mr. Robins property. Because of no objections to the annexation a motion was made by Councilman Kincaid and seconded by Councilman Sommerseth that Ordinance No. 667 be passed. Motion carried.

No. 3, the Grandview Addition, extending from Ninth avenue to tenth ave., and south to 2<sup>nd</sup> St. Wire Attorney Holte reported 90% of the property had signed for this annexation. A motion was made by Councilman Bishop and seconded by Councilman Talen that Ord. No. 668 annexating this property to the City be passed. Motion carried.

This was also the night set for a hearing on the rezoning of three lots of property on the west side of Third Avenue, the Planning committee recommended and a motion was made by councilman Bishop and seconded by Councilman Kincaid that the request for rezoning the west side of Third avenue be denied because of existing laws and ordinances. Motion carried.

Commissioner Mr. Albright and Fire Chief <sup>Carl Eisen</sup> from Fire District No. 1 came before the Council asking to have a written agreement with Edmonds Fire Department, Fire Chief Jim Astell stated it was not necessary to have an agreement in writing, he stated that the State Law takes care of it. Mayor Maxwell asked for have the agreement returned to us for reconsideration.

Attorney Holte reported that he has another preposed annexation to the City, a motion was made by councilman Talen and seconded by councilman Bishop that October 4 be set for the hearing date, subject to Attorney Holte checking the percentage of signatures. Motion carried.

Mr. Usher again came before the council in regards to the drainage water that backs up in his basement, when we have a heavy rain. The water committee recommended and a motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by Councilman Cloud that the Engineer draw up specification for a storm sewer and call for bids, to be opened October 18, to be paid for from Sewer Service charge. Motion carried.

Chairman of the water Committee Tuson stated the wood water tower in South Edmonds is being taken down.

It was recommended by Chairman of street committee Kincaid that the grade for Tenth and Daley street as established by Engineer Reid be the final grade.

Attorney Holte reported that Mr. Van Sullivan has accepted \$7000 for his property. He also reported Mr. Grimes has offered \$5500 for his property at Fifth & Edmonds street and Mr. Nicolay asks \$3100.00

A motion was made by councilman Kincaid and seconded by councilman Bishop that the bill for \$382 for Engineering on the water department be paid. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Kincaid and seconded by councilman Sommerseth that up to \$100 be allowed to equip the auxiliary police with caps and badges. Motion carried.

A motion was made by councilman Tuson and seconded by councilman Talen that the five vacancies <sup>on the planning committee</sup> be replaced by the following Preston Steed, Sprule McGinness, David Crow, Mason Hall, Alton Phillips, <sup>Appointments made by Mayor Maxwell</sup> the conformation being made by the Council. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Bishop and seconded by councilman Talen that the final plat of Neil addition be accepted. Motion carried.

> The Council accepted the plat of Glandville addition.  
There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
